## Section C - Descriptions and Specifications

STATEMENT OF WORK**1. BACKGROUND**

The Department of Defense (DoD) established the Computer/Electronic Accommodations Program (CAP) in 1990 to improve accessibility for people with disabilities throughout the DoD and remove the cost of accommodations. The TRICARE Management Activity (TMA), a field activity in the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Health Affairs), serves as the executive agent for CAP. CAP is housed at TMA's Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO). CAP's mission is to provide assistive technology and accommodations to ensure people with disabilities and wounded service members have equal access to the information technology environment and opportunities in DoD and throughout the Federal Government. In October 2000, the National Defense Authorization Act granted CAP the authority to provide assistive technology, devices, and services to any department or agency in the Federal Government upon the request of the head of the agency. Via this authority, CAP is the Federal Government's centrally funded accommodations program, providing assistive technology solutions at no cost to the requesting agency. Much of CAP's success lies in the ability to provide assistive technology and reasonable accommodations to employees quickly and easily, which can increase employment and retention of employees with disabilities.

On October 17, 2006, the National Defense Authorization Act granted CAP the authority to provide assistive technology to wounded/injured service members allowing them to retain the equipment upon separation. CAP provides the assistive technology to the service members and coordinates the service as outlined in the Department of Defense Instruction (DoDI) 6025.22. Since the inception of CAP, procurement of information technology management support services provided best administrative value to CAP as it expanded and provided over 12,000 assistive technology and accommodation services to 68 Federal agency partners and wounded Service members in the recent Fiscal Year.

**2. OBJECTIVE**

Provide Assistive Technology and Accommodation Services to Federal Employees with disabilities and Wounded Service Members.

**3. SCOPE**

This award provides assistive technology to Wounded Service Members with Cognitive Impairments.

This request is to provide Apple iPad 2s, Droid Xs, Blackberry Bold 9700s, a Blackberry Curve 8520, an HTC HD2, a Motorola Droid 3, and a Bluetooth Keyboard for the iPad 2 to Wounded Service Members CONUS and OCONUS.

- Apple iPad 2: is a tablet device that serves as a platform for audio-visual media that may also be used as a cueing/memory aid/Independent Personal Digital Assistant (PDA). The iPad is controlled by a multitouch display, which can be used with a finger or stylus as well as a virtual onscreen keyboard. The iPad runs applications that are available through the App Store. The iPad comes standard with basic applications such as built-in accessibility options, calendar, notes, alarms, camera and GPS.
- The BlackBerry Bold 9700 smart phone has a large, hi-resolution screen that displays over 65,000 colors and a full keyboard in the QWERTY layout. The Blackberry Operating System offers management of all contact and calendar information, while the information is customizable to the individual through third-party applications. Navigation is made simple on this bluetooth and Wi-Fi compatible device with a touch-sensitive trackpad.
- Motorola Droid X2 smartphone runs on Android 2.2 operating system and is powered by 1.2GHz TI OMAP3630 processor. The Droid X2 features 4.3-inch touchscreen display and includes applications such as a calendar, alarms, and has built in accessibility features. This smartphone is available unlocked for individuals with Verizon cell phone service carriers.
- Motorola Droid 3 runs on the Android 2.3 operating system and is powered by a 1GHz Dual-core processor. The Droid 3 features 4in display and full QWERTY keyboard. Applications include calendar, alarms, and built in accessibility features. The phone is available without a contract for Verizon service.
- The Naztech All-in-One Bluetooth Keyboard with Case is a 360-degree rotating stand/case that allows you to view an iPad in landscape or portrait view. The slider keyboard allows one to type at their preference. The soft touch rubber finish provides a secure and comfortable grip as well as excellent protection from any scratches or bumps.
- The Blackberry Curve 8520 has a bright screen that displays over 65,000 colors and a full QWERTY keyboard layout. The features a 2.6in screen, bluetooth and Wi-Fi compatibility, calendar and alarm functions. Available through GSM carriers such as T-Mobile.
- The HTC HD2 is an unlocked GSM smartphone that runs on Windows Mobile 6.5, and it has Wi-Fi and Bluetooth compatibility. The smartphone possesses organizer, voice, memos, and calendar capabilities that allow individuals to maintain schedules and appointments. It also features a large 4.3 inch corner-to-corner 480x800 resolution screen, which allows for clear and precise images to assist in daily activities.

#### **4. OTHER CONSTRAINTS/CONSIDERATIONS**

- 4a Shipping: Items will need to be shipped to any CAP customer within the Department of Defense or one of their partner agencies around the world. The items will need to be shipped to the customers within 5 days of receipt of the order. To ensure delivery, the ship to addresses should not be altered. Need to be shipped as provided. (SEE ATTACHED SPREADSHEET)
- 4b Proof of Delivery: To secure payment the vendor must provide proof of delivery and signed acceptance receipt of package along with the invoice. Vendor should EITHER provide a spreadsheet to include, at a minimum; recipient name, item(s) sent, mailing tracking number, and mailing carrier OR individual invoice that includes the mailing tracking number and carrier via attachment to the WAWF system, email, or fax.
- 4c Payment: Vendors will need to ship all items to each CAP customer per Purchase Order Award before submitting a payment request into the Wide Area Workflow (WAWF). Vendors should NOT split the Purchase Order Award. Once all items have been shipped per customer and purchase order, the vendor should submit the one charge (referencing the purchase order award) for all items into WAWF. Vendors should NOT have separate charges per individual shipment.

**Apple iPad 2**

The Apple iPad 2 is currently the only device that provides the necessary cueing/memory aids/Independent Personal Digital Assistant (PDA) to the wounded Service members on this request. It is a lighter weight than other tablets and the first generation iPad, yet large enough for a Service Member with Vision or Dexterity limitations to use. This device allows users to access PDA independent from phone service and does not require a data plan (which other smartphones require) that would cause extra costs to be incurred by the recipient. The Apple iPad 2 includes a camera feature, which serves as a cueing aid for Service Members who process images better than text. It also allows Service Members to use the video function of the camera to attend meetings without having to be physically present. The Apple iPad 2 also has built in accessibility features, including voice over, zoom features and inverted color contrast, which is important because many of the Service members have more than one injury they are recovering from. Apple also has many applications that are available to assist the Service members with injuries, deficits and the rehabilitation process, including those that allow for speech-to-text, augmentative communication abilities and readers to assist with dexterity, speech and vision deficits. These apps are available only on Apple (itunes) and when compared against the HP, Samsung, Dell tablets, these apps were not available. No other stand alone devices would support these specific applications. The medical professionals at the various military treatment facilities request the iPad 2 because they are able to find avenues to procure these apps and use them in the rehabilitation and recovery of the Service members. The device is the only one that provides all these features and is often requested specifically by the Service members' rehabilitation team to assist with deficits and recovery.

**Blackberry Bold 9700**

The Blackberry Bold 9700 provides the necessary cueing/memory aids and Independent Personal Digital Assistant (PDA) for Service Members with cognitive limitations. This device is one of the few smart phones that is available unlocked for individuals with a GSM cell phone service provider. The Blackberry Operating System offers management of all contact and calendar information, while the information is customizable to the individual through third-party applications. Navigation is made simple on this bluetooth and Wi-Fi compatible device with a touch-sensitive trackpad. The Blackberry Bold 9700 also features a document editor (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, PDF); Access to personal and corporate email; and BlackBerry maps. The device provides all of the features of a PDA in one device and was specifically requested by the Service Members' rehabilitation team to assist with their transition.

**Droid X2 Touchscreen**

The Droid X2 Touchscreen is a smartphone that serves as a cueing/memory aid and Independent Personal Digital Assistant (PDA). This device is one of the few smartphones that is available

unlocked for individuals with Verizon as their cell phone service provider. The Android Operating System offers management of all contact and calendar information, while the information is customizable to the individual through third-party applications. The Droid X Touchscreen offers features such as a calendar, alarm, GPS, Picture Messaging, touchscreen, vibrate, voice dialing, and voice memos. These features are beneficial for Service Members with cognitive limitations and Service Members who may also have dexterity limitations as it is an all-in-one device, eliminating the need to carry multiple pieces of equipment. The Droid X Touchscreen provides all of the features of a PDA in one device and was specifically requested by the Service Members' rehabilitation team to assist with their transition

### **HTC HD 2**

The HTC HD 2 is a smartphone that serves as a cueing/memory aid and Independent Personal Digital Assistant (PDA). Unlike many purchased smartphones, this device can be purchased unlocked for individuals with GSM cell phone service provider. The Microsoft Windows Mobile 6.5 Professional operating system offers management of all contact and calendar information, Internet Explorer, Windows Marketplace, and Microsoft Office Mobile. Microsoft Office Mobile allows the user to access Word, Excel, PowerPoint, OneNote, and PDF viewer to enable work from any location. Due to its large 4.3 inch corner-to-corner screen and its high 480x800 screen resolution, Service members suffering cognitive disabilities with additional visual deficits can benefit from both the memory assistance and the visual clarity of this smartphone. Its touchscreen allows for additional dexterity assistance as some Service members may not be able to precisely select buttons on a keypad. This smartphone's was specifically recommended by rehabilitation professionals due to these features.

### **Blackberry Curve 8520**

This smartphone provides assistance for memory, time management, organization, and managing daily tasks. These capabilities are provided in an "all-in-one" format along with voice communication capabilities, necessary for an individual with TBI who cannot keep up with multiple devices due to memory impairments. This device is considered a "world phone" that will work on different continents, making it necessary for Service members stationed in Europe who have the described limitations, and the described needs for an all-in-one device.

### **Motorola Droid 3**

This memory/cueing aid provides calendar and appointment tracking, voice recognition capabilities, as well as a slide-out QWERTY keyboard and a touchscreen keyboard. The device also has a voice recorder for notes and daily documentation, as well as the capability to support Android apps for literacy and communication. This device also provides voice communication in an all-in-one package, and is compatible with the Verizon communications network.

### **Naztech Bluetooth Keyboard and Case for iPad 2**

This keyboard connects wirelessly to an external memory/cueing device. This external keyboard provides standard-keyboard input to the memory/cueing device for those individuals who have significant injuries to the upper extremities, making use of the on-screen keyboard extremely difficult or impossible.
