Electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (eSRS)

TYPE OF ACTION: Interim Rule

EFFECTIVE DATE: October 25, 2010

SUMMARY: This interim rule supersedes Class Deviation 2008-O0008: Class Deviation-Electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (12 Feb 2009); and Class Deviation 2009-O0006: Class Deviation-Modification of Class Deviation 2008-O0008-Electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (6 May 2009).

The interim rule provides DoD-specific policy and procedures related to the Electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (eSRS) to conform to Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) revisions reflecting use of the eSRS.

Use the clause at DFARS 252.219-7003, Small Business Subcontracting Plan (DoD Contracts) (October 2010):

- In solicitations and contracts that contain the clause at FAR 52.219-9, Small Business Subcontracting Plan.
- With its Alternate I in contracts that use Alternate III of FAR 52.219-9, Small Business Subcontracting Plan.

In contracts with contractors that have comprehensive subcontracting plans approved under the test program described in DFARS 219.70[8], use the clause at DFARS 252.219-7004, Small Business Subcontracting Plan (Test Program)(OCT 2010), instead of the clauses at DFARS clause 252.219-7003, Small Business Subcontracting Plan (DoD Contracts), and FAR clause 52.219-9, Small Business Subcontracting Plan. Include -

- FAR clause 52.219-9, Small Business Subcontracting Plan and DFARS clause 252.219-7003 in the contract for purposes of the contractor flowing these clauses down to subcontractors, except

- When the contract will not be reported in FPDS (see FAR 4.606 (c)(5)), include FAR clause 52.219-9, Small Business Subcontracting Plan with its Alternate III and DFARS clause 252.219-7003 Small Business Subcontracting Plan (DoD Contracts) with its Alternate I in the contract for purposes of the contractor flowing these clauses down to subcontractors.

Additionally, there are minimum changes to “Appendix I, Policy and Procedures for the DoD Pilot Mentor” regarding reporting requirements for those contracts awarded under the Department of Defense Pilot Mentor-Protégé Program (DFARS 219.71).

ACTION REQUIRED: Contracting Officers should familiarize themselves with these DFARS changes and include appropriate clauses as prescribed in accordance DFARS 219.708.

This Policy Alert is effective on the dates indicated above, and remains in effect until a final rule is incorporated into DFARS or otherwise rescinded.
