**Report on:  
The Department of Defense and Department of Veterans Affairs  
Vision Center of Excellence**

**BACKGROUND**

Section 1623 of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2008 directed the Department of Defense (DoD) to establish a center of excellence in the prevention, diagnosis, mitigation, treatment, and rehabilitation of military eye injuries. The DoD is to collaborate to the maximum extent practicable with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), as well as educational institutions and other public and private entities. The Center shall be referred to as the Vision Center of Excellence (VCE).

One of the Center's responsibilities is to implement a comprehensive plan and strategy for a registry of information for the tracking of the diagnosis, surgical intervention or other operative procedures, other treatments, and follow up for each case of significant eye injury incurred by a member of the Armed Forces while serving on Active Duty. Additionally, the Secretary of Defense and Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall jointly ensure that the information within the Registry is available to the appropriate ophthalmological and optometric personnel of the DoD and VA in order to encourage and facilitate the research, as well as the development of best practices and clinical education, on eye injuries incurred by members of the Armed Forces in combat. The Registry shall be referred to as the Defense and Veterans Eye Injury and Vision Registry. (DVEIVR).

Another responsibility of the VCE is to coordinate care and benefits between the DoD and VA, including the development of a comprehensive program for Armed Forces members with Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) post-traumatic visual syndrome for the purpose of vision screening, diagnosis, rehabilitative management, and vision research, including research on prevention and visual dysfunction related to TBI.

House Report 111-105, p 29, Supplemental Appropriations for FY 2009, included the following language: "The Committee understands that the Department is currently determining the proper location for the Center of Excellence as part of the consolidation of National Capitol Region facilities. The Committee directs that within 60 days of enactment of this Act the Department report on the status of this process and costs that would be associated with the establishment of this center."

The VCE will be located on the ground floor of Building 2 in the future Walter Reed National Military Medical Center (WRNMMC) adjacent to the Ophthalmology and Optometry Clinics and the Refractive Surgery Center allowing for collaboration and synergies with the vision care providers and patients in the National Capital Region. The location also provides close proximity to the new National Intrepid Center of Excellence (NICoE) for Traumatic Brain Injury, the National Eye Institute of the National Institute of Health, the Food & Drug Administration, the Uniformed Services University, and the National Military Advanced Training Center.

The space for the VCE is currently occupied by the Navy Exchange Uniform Shop. The Uniform Shop will be relocated to Building 1 currently being used as classrooms. The classrooms will be relocated and accommodated in spaces to be renovated within buildings 3 and 5. Renovation of the VCE spaces will be done in conjunction with renovation of the adjacent Optometry Clinic, which is being funded by and phased with the BRAC project at WRNMMC. When completed, the VCE will accommodate a staff of 25 personnel in 3,600 gsf and will provide informational kiosk areas to support visually impaired wounded warriors and their families.

The FY09 War Supplemental Appropriations contained \$4.052 million to support this effort. The funding is sufficient to renovate and outfit spaces for the VCE and to move and renovate spaces for the NEX Uniform Shop. The funding has been received by BUMED Naval Facilities Command, and the VCE facility design is underway. The timeline for execution remains dependent on the BRAC Optometry Clinic renovation. Currently, construction is estimated to start 3Q FY 2010 and to be completed 3Q FY 2011.

**SUBJECT: Delegation of Authority Under Section 1623 of the National Defense  
Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2008 and Sections 721-723 of the Duncan  
Hunter National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2009 for the  
Establishment of Health Care Centers of Excellence**

You are hereby delegated the authority and assigned the responsibility of the Secretary of Defense under Section 1623 of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2008, Public Law 110-181, and Sections 721-723 of the Duncan Hunter National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2009, Public Law 110-417, concerning the establishment of Centers of Excellence for the prevention, diagnosis, mitigation, treatment, research, and rehabilitation of military eye injuries and diseases, including visual dysfunctions related to traumatic brain injury; hearing loss and auditory system injuries; and traumatic extremity injuries and amputations. This delegation includes other matters provided for in said sections in partnership and/or collaboration to the maximum extent practicable with the Department of Veterans Affairs, institutions of higher education, and other appropriate public and private entities (including international entities). This delegation includes the Principal Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness.

In the absence of an Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness (USD(P&R)) and, a Principal Deputy USD(P&R), the authorities delegated by this memorandum may be exercised by an official performing the duties of the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness. The authorities delegated by this memorandum may be re-delegated in writing to the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health Affairs (ASD(HA)) and, in the absence of an ASD(HA) or Principal Deputy ASD(HA), may be exercised by an official performing the duties of the ASD(HA). Further re-delegation is not authorized.



<b>PROJECT:</b> This project will provide space for the new Vision Center of Excellence adjacent to the new Optometry Clinic planned for BRAC relocation to spaces within Building 2. The project will also provide expanded space for the NEX Uniform Shop as required to accommodate existing inventory and the increase in inventory necessary to support the uniform requirements of the Army and Air Force personnel who will be added to the staff of the Medical Center as result of the BRAC realignment.						
<b>REQUIREMENT:</b> NDAA 2008 (Section 1623) directed the DoD to establish a Vision Center of Excellence (VCE) to promote the prevention, diagnosis, mitigation, treatment, and rehabilitation of disorders of the visual system. The VCE is also charged with developing a Defense and Veterans Eye Injury Registry (DVEIR) to track eye injuries and promote research into treatment and rehabilitation. The VCE is designed to improve the care of military personnel and veterans affected by eye trauma and assist those suffering vision damage associated with Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and Post Traumatic Visual Syndrome. The VCE is required to establish its headquarters in the National Capital Region. Additionally, the Exchange Uniform Shop must expand to support the BRAC acquired Tri- Service military members in their uniform requirements.
