Ms. Weese is currently serving as the Acting Executive Director of the Federal Recovery Coordination Program, a joint program of the Departments of Defense and Veterans Affairs. Prior to joining FRCP, she was a program analyst in the Office of Policy and Planning (OPP) at the staff office of the Wounded, Ill, and Injured

Senior Oversight Committee. Prior to joining the Department of Veterans Affairs in June 2008, she worked in a program for the Chief of Naval Personnel conducting workforce analysis. She began her government career in 1989 at National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, Maryland where she held many positions from staff perioperative registered nurse to administration. She is a graduate of the University of Virginia.

Michael J. MacDonald, Deputy Director for Benefits Federal Recovery Coordination Program

Mr. MacDonald joined the Federal Recovery Coordination Program in February 2009 as the Deputy Director for Benefits. He is responsible for providing guidance on VA benefits to the FRCP Director, supervision of Federal Recovery Coordinators, and liaison with DoD and Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA) on issues concerning the recovery, rehabilitation and reintegration of seriously wounded, ill, and injured Service members, Veterans and their families. He began his career with VBA in September 1977 as a Veterans Claims Examiner at the Nashville Regional Office. He worked through various positions at the regional office before coming to Washington in September 2006 to work in the VBA Compensation and Pension Service. In January 2007, he joined the staff of the VBA's Office of Policy and Program Management as a Management and Program Analyst and later assumed the duties of the Outreach Coordinator for VBA. After serving in the United States Marine Corps, he attended Michigan State University for undergraduate work and Central Michigan University for graduate work.
